



RECTOR'S LETTER Pentecost 2009 (September)

Good People:

David Letterman has them, Jay *should* have had them, who knows where Conan will go, if at all! The TOP TEN are a regular part of the start of every Letterman show, so why shouldn't I get Top Ten too? After all, we are about to start the Fall Pledge campaign for 2010 and I have a Top Ten list about pledging, so here goes:

10. No matter how the response of the congregation goes, the vestry and I are committed to quality liturgy, a strong public witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and the opportunity for spiritual growth for adults and young people. In short, we will strive for what is good for Gospel witness in the contemporary culture, not vending the Faith as a product.
9. The pledge campaign is the major litmus test of the strength of the relationships within the congregation. That in turn measures the presence of the Holy Spirit. Those who have been touched in some way by the Holy Spirit pledge. Of the 375 families affiliated with Grace Church about half pledge.
8. Of those who do pledge to the parish, most of them participate in other areas of parish life. If one totals up the ministry presence of people in worship, church school, Helping Hands, Midnight Run and all the programs only about 10% of the names of those who pledge do not appear on the lists. We are committed to our Faith!
7. The pledge campaign supports the saving of lives. Participants in Twelve Step, Helping Hands and Midnight Run actually save lives. Those who pledge know that 'their' salvation is also 'our' salvation for we cannot be saved without following the commandment of Jesus to love one another as we are loved.
6. Church is a counter-culture in the entertainment-consumer world. Most of the culture worships at the malls, in front of HDTV, and such places. Pledging to the Church makes a statement about where one's values are.
5. The plain truth is that to maintain the parish we have built here costs \$16.00 per person per week. Look to the left and right, in front and behind you at Eucharist and you will not put a price tag on those people who are your worshiping community, but now you know what it takes to be at Eucharist.
4. Jesus talked more about money than love. What was *that* all about? Christ knew that it is an illusion to separate earthly means from spirituality and to do so is to create the illusions that breed violence, self centeredness and resentments. Spiritual health is based on the union of the material and the spiritual.
3. Christ offered salvation not comfort. Comfort may be a byproduct, but salvation is the journey from the self as center to the acknowledgment that we cannot save ourselves. "Amazing Grace" is exactly that. Pledging is the way to keep the spiritual door open to the salvation of Christ, the grace we all seek.

2. This whole world hungers for a 'lost' spirituality, something to fill the void of meaning which seems to elude the grasp and defy definition. The substitute is the violence rampant in everything from public rhetoric to guns. Christianity offers an alternative trying to fill the empty places in the heart. When this parish witnesses to the Gospel we are actually setting places at the Table for any who want to have the empty places filled. This is what we are supporting with our pledges.

AND NUMBER 1:

It is an effort to write a check. One has to think about it. Every time I write a check to make my pledge I think I am embracing the generosity of spirit that Christ called me to in baptism. In short, I am born again...and again...and again through this little act and this small gesture. It is the 'work' of faith and the Faith.

So there it is: my Top Ten reasons to pledge this Fall. Now if I could just work this into shape for late night television...who knows?

A NOTE FROM THE SENIOR WARDEN

As you all know, last year was the most difficult budget year that we have had in some time. The economic uncertainty that we were all facing had a chilling effect on our pledge drive and on our ability to meet our budgetary needs. As a result, the vestry made the most difficult decision to reduce the salary of our valued staff, including the rector and assistant to the rector. The "Second Mile" campaign helped to close some of the gaps in the budget, but not enough to restore salary and pension losses.

CHURCH SCHOOL REGISTRATION

Church School registration will be take place on **Sunday, September 13 immediately following the 9:30 family service, during the Parish Volunteer Ministry Fair.** A new form must be filled out each year to ensure that we have the most current information on your children. Church school is available free of charge for children aged 4 years old - 8th grade thanks to the hard work of our volunteer teachers and Youth Commission.

Information will also be available regarding **Senior Youth Group** for High School aged youth. This group meets on Sunday evenings (6:30—8:30pm) in Bradley Chapel. Curriculum includes teambuilding activities, topics related to spiritual growth, youth presentations about their countries and community service. Their first meeting is September 20.

CHURCH SCHOOL CALENDAR

Classes will begin the on **Sunday, September 20**, and run through June 13, 2010. Special exceptions include days off following the school calendar and family activities to recognize important holidays.

Class for the 4 year olds through 5th grade will once again combine a lectionary based lesson and choir instruction and last approximately 60 minutes. Four year olds through second grade will sing with Miss Bonnie as their leader in the **Joyful Noise Gospel Choir** performing at the 9:30 service on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Third through fifth graders will be led by Maija Kupris as part of the **St. Cecilia Choir** and will sing during the 9:30 service on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month and with the Grace Church adult choir during scheduled 11:00am services.

Junior Youth Group (JYG) is for 6th-8th graders and will run about 45 minutes. There is no choir component to JYG. A special JYG calendar will be distributed at the beginning of the year including special activities such as skiing, rafting and Night Watch.

Confirmation Class ((8th grade and 13 years old is the minimum requirement) begins with Orientation on September 16 at 7:00pm — pre-registration is required, so speak with Mtr. Emily (esieracki@gracechurchnyack.org) if you have not yet registered.

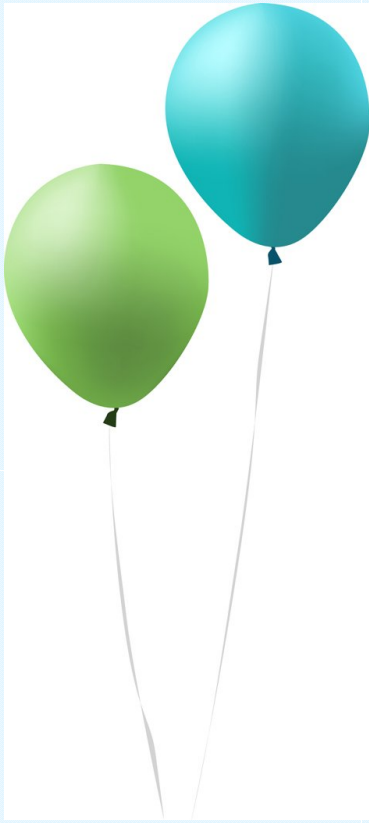

ANONYMOUS 4 TO OPEN GRACEMUSIC'S 40th SEASON WITH BENEFIT CONCERT FOR GRACE CHURCH

Anonymous 4 will open GraceMusic's 40th season on **Saturday, October 10, at 7:30pm**. The internationally known women's vocal group will sing a new program of selections called "Secret Voices."

Anonymous 4, which includes Nyack resident and founding member Susan Hellauer, has garnered many awards and attracted a large and enthusiastic following with its recordings of the music of Hildegard von Bingen, An English Lady Mass, American spirituals ("American Angels"), and many others. Their sweet and pure, beautifully blended voices have shone to wonderful effect on repertoire ranging from the baroque and early American to contemporary pieces composed for them.

The October 10 concert features the varied repertoire of 13th-century polyphony and sacred Latin song collected in the Spanish *Las Huelgas* Codex for a convent of aristocratic women. In spite of a rule forbidding women of their order from singing polyphony, these sophisticated ladies sang the most beautiful, and demanding music from all over Europe.

GraceMusic began 40 years ago with the first Messiah Sing and has presented concert programs every fall and spring season since then. GraceMusic's 40th annual Messiah Sing —will be on December 6.

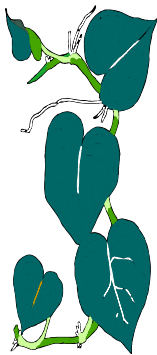
Walkways and Garden Renovation
