#### Senior Warden's Update

Rector Search. We are almost done. First, I want to give my thanks to the entire transition team: Beth Paskowski, the chair and team members Verne Becker, Roy Kepler, Valerie Matthews, Emily Nevill, Dillon Nittoli, Edward Van Saders, Claudia Uccellani, Liz Johnson Weber, and Margie Winslow, for the many hours that they have put in over the last year. We all owe them all our thanks and appreciation. The vestry was provided the names of two candidates for consideration two weeks ago, and we have conducted in person interviews with both. We will be meeting again in the next week to reflect and reach a unanimous decision on who we will call to be the next Following our rector of Grace Episcopal Church. decision, we will advise the bishop and assuming his assent, we will inform our choice and negotiate a contract. I hope that we will complete this process by the middle of November, and I will be able to inform the congregation. We expect that our new rector will join us in early January. I ask that you keep the vestry and our candidates in your prayers as we complete this process.

Another gift from Christ Church Cathedral in Cincinnati. We received a letter from The Very Rev. Owen C. Thompson two weeks ago and enclosed was a check in the amount of \$40,000 from his cathedral. This latest gift comes on top of two previous gifts of \$10,000 each that we received in the last year. Fr. Owen and Christ Church Cathedral have been very supportive, and we are grateful that he continues to keep Grace in his prayers and thoughts.

**Brief overview of Grace Finances.** As we approach the end of the year, the standing committee on finance and vestry are keeping a close eye on Grace's financial status. The double impact of COVID on all of us and being in a transition period between rectors has had an effect, but we are doing okay.

Our general financial position is stable. Some expenditures are exceeding what we budgeted for, but other expenditures are substantially below what we budgeted for. The bottom line on expenditures is that as of the end of September we have expended \$7,500 less than we had budgeted – we hope that continues. In terms of income, our pledge income is below what we budgeted for and that is a matter of concern. We have been fortunate that other sources of income – i.e., facility rental – the HBO project brought in \$25,000 and gifts other than pledge – i.e., Fr. Owen's and a few other gifts have helped considerably to make up the shortfall in pledge income. We will watch as the year nears an end.

A budget committee has been formed and will begin the process of preparing the budget for 2023 in the next few weeks. The stewardship campaign is ongoing, and a key component will be who are new rector is and the need to factor that person's compensation into the budget. We will know more by the start of December.

**Advent Party.** Due to COVID Grace has not had an Advent party for several years. Program Council (another group that hasn't met for several years) met and has set December 4 - following the 4:00pm service of choral evensong - as the date for this year's Advent party. **Our nominating committee** has formed and will begin its work soon. They will be tasked with identifying parishioners for positions on the vestry (3 3-year terms), delegates and alternates to the Diocesan Convention as well as non-vestry members of next year's nominating committee. Stewardship is not just about treasure – it is also about time and talent – to be a thriving parish, your time and talents are as important if not more so.

## **COVID RISK UPDATE**

**GRACE** HUNCH WACK Based on CDC data, the Rockland County COVID rate has recently moved to medium. While not required, the

wearing of masks is strongly encouraged at Grace. The wearing of masks by ushers and those serving on the altar will continue.

A reminder about receiving wine at communion. The approved methods are:

- sip directly from the chalice (chalice bearers are expected to wipe the chalice both inside and out, and spin it a quarter turn after each person receives, or
- take the wafer in your hand and allow the chalice bearer to dip the wafer and return it to your hand for you to consume.

# What Prevention Steps Should You Take Based on Your COVID-19 Community Level?

At medium risk level CDC guidelines suggest:

- If <u>at high risk for severe illness</u>, talk to your healthcare provider about whether you need to wear a mask and take other precautions
- Stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccines
- Get tested if you have symptoms

# Another in the Tales of The Shop Series Two Hours and Thirty Minutes Theresa Bergen

The most frequent question at the Shop is: *How does this all work?* The answer - strangely enough - depends on the questioner.

From someone who is unfamiliar with the concept of thrift shops: Answer: "People give us stuff, we sell it and give the money away" Response: One customer, who had very little English and we had NO Ger-

man, finally nodded saying "That's a lot of three dollar".

#### From someone who is not too sure we aren't a scam:

Answer: "We are a charity, all volunteers, established in 1968 and we gave away \$28,000 dollars in 2021.... <u>Here's our brochure and list of charities</u>"

Response: something along the lines of: "Oh... you have a list" (You can almost see the wheels turning: "Well, if they have a printed list it must be legit")

#### From someone who has just tried to haggle over a \$5 item.

Answer: while handing them a brochure and say: "We are a charity. We feed people. Yes we collect tax . That's \$5.42, please."

Response: If done correctly, "keep the change". (The trick is to induce some guilt but not embarrassment)

The exchanges are usually fun. We work to fit the word charity into every conversation. We want people to feel that they are part of a larger experience. We want them to understand how good charity/love feels . We want them to come back... we want them to donate stuff... we want to volunteer which in our little world is the ultimate.

Answer: It works two hours and thirty minutes at a time. That's one shift. We can offer you an opportunity to work at **your** charity **ONE Saturday a MONTH.** That's right... just 2 hours and 30 minutes a MONTH **and you can be part of a Nyack institution.** We used to do it that way.

You could make such a difference. We are short one person on Saturday leaving 2 volunteers to cover the shift. That's hard.

You could make such a difference. Two Saturday regulars are on their second shift of the week and another is on her third. That's hard.

You could make such a difference. Charity is love and if you don't have a regular gig that lets you feel that come to us for 2 hours and 30 minutes **ONE** Saturday a MONTH. That's easy. I know, for about 20 years I worked a shift every first Saturday.

Response: That's up to you.

(We are an equal opportunity organization and men are welcome. We have two who work a regular shift)

Opening Prayer – Sally Cochran Minutes from June 2022 meeting were approved

**Senior Warden:** The senior warden informed the vestry of Pastor Tyler's decision to not extend his contract with Grace past the end of September. An appropriate farewell celebration will be scheduled to honor his service to Grace. Thayer is working to schedule supply priests for the months of October and November at least in expectation that the new Rector will not start just after Pastor Tyler departs.

#### Standing Committee on Finance—J. McDowell

- Materials were submitted prior to the meeting and vestry members were asked to review. The major points in the report were:
- Pledge income off by \$8K from where it should be.
- Expenses are above the projections for the budget.
- Generally, finances are in okay shape, due in part to large gifts that have helped cover shortfall in pledge income, but budget for 2023 may be a challenge due to need to pay salary and benefits to new rector. The extent of challenge will become more clear as budget is developed later in the year.
   The report from SCOF was approved

#### Standing Committee on Property—E. Nevill

- Materials were submitted prior to the meeting and vestry members were asked to review. The major points in the report were:
- Filming for the Gilded Age went well
- A Bike Rack has been ordered
- Verne Becker is working on soliciting bids for Wi-Fi upgrades for Grace
- AC units in Bradley and Memorial Hall now working bers participating and working on merit badges.
- Termite damage has been identified at the entrance to the Church
- The second floor of 137 is now vacant, has been inspected and needs substantial work. A committee has been formed to review what needs to be done and other matters related to this property.

 Work on the rectory continues – bids for kitchen renovation being solicited, exterior painting being completed by Jim Sevier with assistance from Eric Case and various odds and ends being completed.
 The Report from SCOP was approved.

#### **Commission Reports:**

**Social Ministry** – Heidi Hill reported that Rockland Interfaith Coalition continues its work to help refugees, Midnight Run continues to prepare meals the second Saturday of every month, and People to People collections in the Narthex continue. Heidi reported that several members of the Vestry completed Stop the Bleed Training.

**Music** – Sally Cochran reported that Jan Valentine continues to provide music while Brandon is away. She reported that Jan had scheduled several special music events for the next month – including Dru Pluhowski would be singing with other members of the Grace Choir that was composed by Grace Church choir member Mary Ann Bleeker. Sally further reported that Grace Music would return in the fall to include the Messiah sing, that Evensong would return in the fall, referenced the need to replace the choir room piano and the need to recruit musicians for the 9:30 service.

**ASF Holly Bee** - reported that the labyrinth visit in June was cancelled due to the extreme heat, but would be rescheduled for the fall. Further, on the 27<sup>th</sup> a poetry, harp, and scripture event in the garden was scheduled and would have as its theme – "Good Trouble" the phrase popularized by the late John Lewis. Scheduled for August Roberta Nobleman would lead a group of parishioners in a read-thru of a play by Rowan Williams

**Boy Scouts** Adrienne Langford – reported that the Scout Troop had concluded their year with an overnight backpack trip to Harriman, a swim party at West Nyack Swim Club and that summer camp at Camp Bullowa was in full swing with two troop members participating and working on merit badges.

Vestry then moved to an agreed task – the writing of post cards to all members of the parish. After half an hour of effort, members collected cards, addresses and stamps to complete the task at home.

Vestry meeting was adjourned at about 9pm.
