What's an Episcopal church?

Who we are

Grace Church is an Episcopal church, which is part of the Anglican Communion of 80 million members worldwide. "Episcopal" simply means governed by bishops. A few features:

- All are welcome and all are loved, from any race, orientation, gender identity, faith background, or no faith.
- · There is freedom to explore your beliefs.
- Women participate fully at all levels in the life and leadership of the Church.
- We take the Bible and its interpretation seriously.
- Church is much more than the building –
 it's the people. Yes, we go to church, but
 our greater challenge is to be the church.
- Our calling is to love and serve everyone, especially poor, needy, and oppressed people.

What goes on in a service?

The liturgy

- Our liturgy, or worship format, is taken from our Book of Common Prayer, and includes recited prayers (some of them sung), hymns (spiritual songs), scripture readings, a sermon, a creed, an offering, and music from the organ and choir.
- In the service, the priest retells the story of God's love and Jesus' sacrifice for the world, and together we celebrate Eucharist (or Holy Communion) by sharing the bread and wine as an outward sign of Christ's Body and Blood, an inward spiritual grace.
- Finally, we give thanks for what God is doing in the world and in our hearts, and we go forth to love and serve God in our world.
- Consult your worship leaflet to figure out when to stand, sit, kneel, sing, etc. as you are able and feel comfortable. All actions are voluntary.
- Episcopalians observe the "seasons" of the church year, including Lent, Easter and Pentecost.
